Romans 12:14-21

“Do not be overcome by evil, but overcome evil with good.” (Verse 21)

How can I overcome evil with good?

1. _____ words of blessing not cursing.
“Bless those who persecute you; bless and do not curse.” (V. 14)

2. _____ your attitude.
“Rejoice with those who rejoice; mourn with those who mourn.” (V. 15)

3. _____ a spirit of pride.
“Live in harmony with one another. Do not be proud, but be willing to associate with people of low position. Do not be conceited.” (V. 16)

4. _____ away from revenge.
“Do not repay evil for evil. Be careful to do what is right in the eyes of everybody. If it is possible, as far as it depends on you, live at peace with everyone. Do not take revenge, my friends, but leave room for God's wrath, for it is written: It is mine to avenge; I will repay.” (Vv. 17-19)

5. _____ reconciliation.
“If your enemy is hungry, feed him; if he is thirsty, give him something to drink. In doing this, you will heap burning coals on his head.” (V. 20)
