Some observations from verses 1 – 3

- The basis of obedience is hearing (verse 3)
- The blessing of obedience (verse 2)

Four principles for Godly parenting

1. Show them your love for God – “love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength.” (v.5)
2. Teach them

3. Warn them
“be careful that you do not forget the Lord, who brought you out of Egypt, out of the land of slavery, fear the Lord your God, serve Him only and take your oaths in His name” (vv. 12 -13)
4. Answer them
“in the future, when your (child) asks you, ‘What is the meaning of the stipulations, decrees and laws the Lord our God has commanded you?’ tell him...” (vv. 20 – 21)
